The building is available for rental for parties of 100 persons or less, comfortable seating approximately 70 persons. A full kitchen is available with all appliances. We do not furnish any tableware, table cloths, electronic equipment, etc. We suggest you visit the building prior to your rental to understand what is available. We furnish all cleanup supplies and provide waste containers renters are required to leave the building as they find it. We do have available a 50" flat screen television with Mediacom Cable, a VCR and CD player. The building is air conditioned and heated, due to it being such a large room we suggest that you arrive early or the day before to set the thermostat to your convenience and return to its normal posted settings.

The Town Hall building was built in 1873. Malta Township donated the building to Malta Historical & Genealogical Society in 1996. A charter group started rehabilitation of the building which had not been used in nearly 20 year. Donations from various persons and organizations started the project. To date much has been accomplished the building has been completely renovated. The building is now used by organizations and for private parties and toured regularly.

Display cases are filled with early Malta items and souvenirs. The archive library consists of voter rolls from 1859 and genealogical material on early settlers. Many early photos are on exhibit.
